Fair Trade Begins at Home

Many of us are familiar with the **Fairtrade** mark, and try to buy Fairtrade products when we go shopping. The Fairtrade website explains its history:



'The first Fairtrade label was launched in 1988 in the Netherlands and applied only to coffee. It was a specific response to the collapse of the world coffee price, which fell for some years to far less than the cost of production, and led to much suffering for coffee farmers and their families.

Today, Fairtrade standards are set for a range of commodities from the developing world including tea, sugar and cocoa. The standards include a Fairtrade price that covers the cost of production and a premium, which is invested in the local community.'

Buying fairly traded goods is a worthwhile, sustainable and practical way to support those who make their living from farming.

So far, Fairtrade has mainly operated in developing countries, but recently the problems that British farmers are facing have been highlighted. People are starting to ask the question, 'where is fair trade for farmers in Britain?'

In a 2006 report commissioned by Sir Don Curry, 86 per cent of consumers said they believe that Britain should be a farming nation, yet just 18 per cent buy British-produced food. This explains, then, why the number of dairy farmers has gone from nearly 200,000 some 50 years ago to just over 12,000 now. The number of hill farms has halved in a decade.

The Farmers' Guardian, Waitrose and Country Living Magazine have come together to campaign around this issue. One of their websites puts it like this:

'How many of us have made a cup of coffee, safe in the knowledge that a producer in Kenya has received a fair price for growing it, yet when we added the milk, didn't give a second thought to the farmer in the UK going under because he's getting less for his milk than it costs to produce? Surely it's time to apply fair trade principles to British farming?'

Under their former "school teacher and conductor" Ingo Schlüchtermann they established a project choir in the year 2000, for people aged 20 to 25, from all over Germany The Ensemble comprises around 20 singers and works on choral literature for four voices in a wide range of different music styles. Their trip to the Yorkshire Dales will be their third concert tour and the opportunity of singing in one of the beautiful, ancient Dales churches fulfils the young musicians with cheerful anticipation.'
