

A letter from our new curate -

We've made it! After what feels like quite a long journey for us, and possibly for some of you too, we are finally here and settling into our new life with you all in Swaledale and Arkengarthdale. We've just about got the house straight (the bits we'd let you see anyway) and have reduced the mountain of boxes to something more like a hillock. We'd both like to express our thanks for the wonderful welcome we've received; to those of you who sent cards and contributed to the magnificent hamper which we're happily chomping our way through.

But as the journey to get here finishes, the next part of the journey is just beginning. On July 4th, I was ordained deacon in Ripon Cathedral. Now I'm just taking the first few tentative steps on the journey towards understanding what that means and the difference it will make, because now that I'm a deacon, I will always be a deacon, even after I've become a priest next year.

So what does it mean to be a deacon? Essentially it's a servant role, following the example of Jesus himself. That's why you'll see me wearing my stoles diagonally, symbolising the towel that Jesus wrapped around himself to wash the disciples' feet. Among other things, the Ordination Service says that deacons are called to work as heralds of Christ's kingdom, to serve the community in which they are set, bringing to the Church the needs and hopes of all the people, and to work with their fellow members in searching out the poor and weak, the sick and lonely and those who are oppressed and powerless, reaching into the forgotten corners of the world, that the love of God may be made visible.

Of course, we're all called to do all these things, and sometimes it might seem like a tall order, but we don't do it alone; we are fellow travellers together on this journey of discipleship. And it's an enormous privilege for me to have the opportunity of walking with you all for the next few years, of serving you and learning with you about what it means to live out our shared faith here in this beautiful part of God's world. I'm excited to see where the journey will take us. I hope you are too.
